Unveiling artwork of Radomir Dvořák

Radomír Dvořák en Schweik

Radomír Dvořák was born in 1959. He lives and works in Havlickuv Brod in Czech-Moravian highlands. His art training, he followed at the Pedagogical University in Hradec Kralove from 1978 to 1983, where he was impressed by the academic painter Borivoj Borovsky.

Lipnice nad Sazavou, East Bohemia, April 27 (CTK) - An unusual 18-tonne granite portrait of Czech writer Jaroslav Hasek, author of the famous Good Soldier


Svejk, was unveiled at the junction of the roads from Lipnice to Dolni Mesto and Svetla nad Sazavou today. The so-called genetically adjusted portrait of Hasek was made by Radomir Dvorak. It is more than two and a half metres high and it bears quotations from The Good Soldier Svejk (1923) in ten languages. The portrait is called Hlava XXII, which literally means Head 22, but it is also the Czech title of the translation of Joseph Heller's satirical war fiction novel Catch-22. Literary critics had allegedly pointed to the similarities between the hero of Catch-22 (1961), Captain John Yossarian and Svejk. In his Closing Time (1994), a sequel to Catch-22, Heller included a conversation between Yossarian and Svejk. Hasek (1883-1923) spent the last part of his life in the small town of Lipnice nad Sazavou. He wrote three of the four volumes of Svejk's adventures during the World War One in a local pub, U Ceske koruny. He was buried at the local cemetery and the town operates the Hasek Museum. Tomas Cihak, Vysocina Tourism regional organisation head, told CTK today that the memorial to Hasek will help attract both Czech and foreign tourists to the region. Cihak said people do not just visit historical monuments anymore but they want to hear some authentic story.
